

The Twinkie Deconstructed mini project presentations begin, Tuesday, April 10 and continue through April 12 – written analysis due 4/12.

Overview:

For an interesting, different, and fun way to learn about an important component of food in America, I have divided the book, Twinkie Deconstructed into 15 (relatively) equal sections which will allow students to read and teach the class a portion of this book.

Expectations for project:

- Carefully read your designated section of the text, and then I recommend that you re-read it as you will be teaching your content to the class. If your portion ends mid-chapter, read to the break in the last page indicated (it will be obvious when you read). You will still present on all material, so don't omit material in the reading and presentation as the next student will pick-up where you left off and continue the overview.
- Prepare (type) a 2-4 page analysis and summation of key points in your section. Paraphrase and cite all material using MLA format – do not plagiarize!! Be sure to include a works cited page as well.
- Also, conduct research on your ingredient(s) discussed in your selection (if you have two partial chapters, conduct the research on the greater portion of the two – use your best judgment here). Your research should include how this/these ingredient(s) is/are used in other foodstuffs, its impact on health, the environment, etc. Each will vary, but you will be teaching the class about your topic. You should include a minimum of 2 additional, quality sources. This means NO WIKIPEDIA!!!!
- Your entire submission should be written and formatted in MLA format including internal citations and a works cited page (not included in the 2-4 pages of written text).
- When you present your section on 4/10 or 4/12, you should also have one visual aid as well. You will be presenting in front of the class.
- Do NOT be absent on this day; your grade will be substantially reduced if you are absent/unprepared this day. As this class also meets the "O" goal for the University's general requirements, both the presentation and written portions will be equally assessed; students will not have the opportunity to make up missed presentations.
- You will be submitting your 2-4 page analysis with works cited page to me in class on 4/12.
- This completed essay will be submitted in your e-portfolio.
- You will ultimately be graded on your presentation, visual aid, written analysis, and timely submission of all components (if any part is late, your grade will be reduced accordingly).
